Pathology Diagnosis and Management in the Dental Patient: Best Practices for the Oral Health Care Provider with Dr. Parish Sedghizadeh Friday, February 23, 2018

Course summary and description: This course is designed for oral health care providers, particularly dentists and dental hygienists, to provide an update in oral pathology and best practices with respect to clinical evaluation and diagnosis of oral lesions. This course is clinically focused to allow immediate translation to daily practice. Common and rare oral conditions ranging from developmental, inflammatory, infectious, and neoplastic etiology will be discussed. Hot topics will also be discussed, such as HPV and oral cancer, bisphosphonate patients and dental care, and medicolegal issues related to dental malpractice.

Outcomes: Participants of this course will gain knowledge into the differential diagnosis of clinical and radiographic oral lesions, and how to reach definitive diagnosis. Participants will learn about the management of common oral conditions, and also preventative and follow-up strategies to minimize medicolegal risk and maximize positive patient outcomes.

Dr. Parish Sedghizadeh is a tenure-track assistant professor at the University of Southern California (USC), Ostrow School of Dentistry, and director of the USC Center for Biofilms. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in biology from UCLA, and his Doctorate of Dental Surgery from USC. After his doctorate, he pursued specialty training in Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology at The Ohio State University, where he also attained a Master of Science degree in Oral Biology and a fellowship in the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. Dr. Sedghizadeh conducts research, publishes, consults and teaches as a maxillofacial pathologist with an active clinical practice at USC. Dr. Sedghizadeh has over 60 peer-reviewed publications, and his research laboratory, clinical practice and clinical research projects at USC currently focus on the characterization and treatment of microbial biofilm infections of the jawbone, particularly jaw osteomyelitis and osteonecrosis of the jaw.
